

F.A.Q. (Frequently Asked Questions)

Where Is the Retreat?

We will leave Temple on Friday, January 29th at 4:00 p.m. and expect to return by noon on Sunday, January 31st.

Where is it, and what are the accommodations?

The retreat will be held at the Joseph Eisner Camp for Living Judaism in Great Barrington, MA. It will take us just under two hours to get there. We will be staying in the Kivie Kaplan Center (KKC). Students will be in rooms holding up to six people. Each room has its own full bath. Most of our indoor program will take place in KKC. In addition the outdoor facilities are quite extensive and we will make use of them as well.

What will they be doing?

We will celebrate Shabbat, play, learn and pray together for about 44 hours. We will all take part in preparing and leading one of the services held during the weekend. We will explore the meaning of prayer, our ideas about God and what it means to each of us to become a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. We will play learning games in and out of doors. We will play sports, dance, sing, run jump and basically do all of the kinds of things one does at summer camp (except swim—it gets cold up there)!

Who will be responsible for my son/daughter?

The staff for the weekend will include Ira Wise, members of the faculty, and teenagers from BIFTY, our Temple Youth Group. We will be staying in KKC with the students.

What do the students need to bring with them?

In addition to clothing students will need a sleeping bag, pillow, towels, toiletries, any sports equipment or instruments they might want, games, cards, etc. A full packing list will be distributed a few weeks before the retreat.

How much will it cost?

The fee of \$190.00 per student includes bus transportation from B'nai Israel to Eisner and back, meals through breakfast on Sunday, lodging and the entire program. There will be no opportunities for spending money during the trip, so none is needed.

What is the deadline for applications?

Applications and payment must be in the Education Center by Wednesday, November 25, 2009.
